SCOTT TINKLER is an award-winning Australian trumpeter who has been performing professionally since 1983 and is well known for his many incarnations as an ensemble player, recording and touring with such groups as the Australian Art Orchestra and the Paul Grabowsky Quintet, and international artists such as Mark Helias, Betty Carter and Guru Kaaraikkudi Mani. Scott has received grants and invitations to perform and present master-classes throughout the world including The Netherlands, India, Hong Kong and Tanzania.
